PROVIDING HOMES FOR ELDERLY AND DISABLED PEOPLE IN NEED – UPDATE MAY 2021

The Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Committee are very pleased to announce important progress in the Parish's journey towards providing sheltered accommodation for elderly and disabled people who need it, while at the same time responding in a practical manner to concerns expressed in last year's survey of opinions.

Over the past few weeks Representatives of the Parish Pastoral Council(PPC), the Parish Finance Committee (PFC) and the Dublin Archdiocese have met with representatives of the charity ALONE and with Dublin City Council (DCC), to progress the decision of the PPC to make two thirds of the Parish Field available to provide sheltered accommodation with security of tenure for elderly and disabled people who need it. The plan envisages a facility to be managed by ALONE following purchase of the land using Government funding via Dublin City Council. One third of the site

will remain as open space which we hope will be of enhanced quality.

Detailed planning is at a very early stage but an unobtrusive development not exceeding three storeys is envisaged and it has at all times been and remains, the firm intention that, prior to lodgement of any application for planning permission, a detailed architectural plan will be made available for Parishioners to examine, with ample opportunity to input observations and suggestions prior to application.

We believe that this project is in keeping with the spirit of the Gospel of Jesus Christ; as a Christian faith community, we are called upon to reach out to, and support the most vulnerable people in our society. The Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance

Committee, therefore, now invite all our fellow parishioners to join constructively with us in supporting provision of state –of- the- art sheltered accommodation for elderly and disabled people in need and in creating a welcoming environment for these new members of our Parish community when they arrive; in this way we will

bear witness that Christ is alive in a tangible way today here in the Parish of St Anthony's.

First Holy Communion 2021 and Confirmation 2021 Extract from Archbishop Dermot Farrell to all parishs in the Diocese

"As we prepare for the safe return to public worship, I am aware of the situation of families whose children are eagerly anticipating the celebration of the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

It is important that these joyful occasions are celebrated with full regard to the continuing threat posed by the circulation of the Virus and in full compliance with public health requirements. The public health advise is that ceremonies such as these should not take place at the time of resumption of public worship

For that reason, celebrations of the sacraments should not take place and dates of celebrations should not be proposed until parishes are notified that it is appropriate to do so (30th April 2921)"

It seems like the sacraments will not take place before the summer at the earliest

Immediately we get any further information we will let you know

As we are only opening our churches for weekend Masses on Sat/Sun 15th/16th May, we feel that it could be too soon to have special Sacramental Masses that weekend.

However, we hope to have a special Sacramental Mass for Confirmation on Pentecost Sat/Sun 22nd/23rd May and for first Communion on Corpus Christi, Sat/Sun 5th/6th June.

Unfortunately, we will still have a very limited capacity in each of the Churches and therefore we will be inviting one candidate and their family from each class groups to represent their fellow classmates.
