Questions for your final exam in liturgy: .
7 Is that a mobile phone I hear or is it a bell?
 It's a bell. Definitely a bell. Its rung three times at the consecration during Mass (consecration, elevation and adoration of the Eucharist). It came into the liturgy before the 13th century and was a call to the people that the most sacred part of the Mass was about to take place. We have to remember that the priest was saying Mass with his back to the people, there were no microphones and Mass was in Latin so it was hard for people to follow what was going on. The ringing of the bells has been kept (though it is not obligatory) in the renewed Mass as a spiritual reminder of the Presence of the Holy One and the echo of the voices of the angles singing "Holy, Holy, Holy"
 The bells on the Church and the bells during holy week are another story.
 Don't miss it.
8. Who in the name of God has left flowers all around the sanctuary? It looks like Moore Street.
 "God has left us three things from Paradise; the stars, the flowers and the smile of a child."
 The first Christians avoided the use of flowers as they were associated with the pagan cult but when the persecutions ended, they began to place them near the altar as a sign of devotion, an unspoken prayer, a reminder of the beauty of creation and especially as a tribute to a provident God.
"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these." (Mt 6,28)
 The flowers also suggest the liturgical season. Easter, is highlighted by lilies and white flowers, in lent generally there are no flowers and advent is
