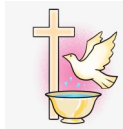

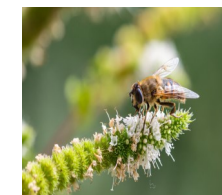

BIODIVERSITY

The following three activities would make a difference in your own homes and gardens:



Grow a native tree or shrub such as birch, guelder rose or hawthorn.
Avoid using tap water to water plants, use rain water collected from gutters so leaving good quality water in the lakes and rivers to be used by the animals and plants which rely on it.
Leave a wild patch in your garden, with no mowing or chemical usage to feed pollinators, insects and invertebrates and ultimately birds. If you are interested in participating in the biodiversity group contact Parish Office
