Funerals are very sacred and sorrowful events and many bereaved people appreciate the Requiem Mass




and the support of the parish faith community. We are hoping to set up a Parish Funeral Ministry Tram



BIODIVERSITY

The following three activities would make a difference in your own homes and gardens:



shrub such as birch, guelder rose or hawthorn.

Avoid using tap water to water plants, use rain water collected from gutters so leaving good quality water in the lakes and rivers to be used by the animals and plants which rely on it.

Leave a wild patch in your garden, with no mowing or chemical usage to feed pollinators, insects and invertebrates and ultimately birds.
